# Monologue Assignment Boltz Drama, Fall 2019 

Performance Date: Monday, December 16 or Wednesday, December 18, 2019
Auditioning is the first step actors take to participate in theatrical productions. A standard requirement of an audition is to perform a prepared monologue. This is your final acting assignment and is meant to provide you with confidence in future auditions. You will work alone and with Miss Harrison to present a short monologue.

Step 1: choose a poem or scripted monologue to perform. You need to be able to describe in depth why you chose this piece before you perform.

Step 2: write out your script/poem on a notecard.
Step 3: prepare your monologue. Use emotion in your voice and facial expressions, plan appropriate physical gestures and staging/movement.

Step 4: practice your monologue MANY times. Swap performances with 2-3 friends in class. Give honest advice to each performer and stay on task.

Step 5: perform your monologue! Remember to describe why you chose this piece before the performance. You will be graded on a scale of 0-4 in the following areas:
